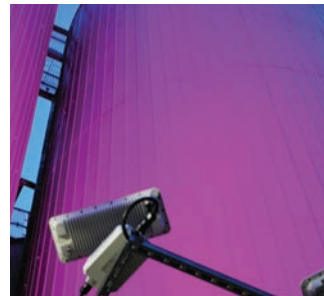

Tennent's Wellpark Brewery – Glasgow, United Kingdom



Based at the historic Wellpark Brewery in Glasgow, Tennent Caledonian is Scotland's preeminent brewer and one of the country's oldest ongoing businesses. The brewery has an industry-leading portfolio of beers, led by the iconic TennentCs Lager, for home and export markets across the world, including the USA, Canada and Europe. Produced since 1885, Tennent's lager is by far the biggest-selling lager in the Scottish market. The main objective was to replace the old architectural lighting system at the nine metallic tanks in the brewery ground with LED systems. The client, Black Light Ltd. selected Traxon Wall Washer Shield AC XB-36 to illuminate the tanks because of its high IP rating and robustness. Intended for wall washing and grazing, the Wall Washer Shield AC XB enables sophisticated bright light output, projecting long distances with a broad range of colors, and is durable for exterior environments. Locally connected to the e:cue Light-Drive Elite, a wall-mounted standalone DMX controller, users can easily setup color-changing effects and control the brightness directly using the device.
